






How many people normally live in your household?




If there needed to be future housing development in the Parish, which type would you support?


Is your employment based from home?






Do you use the 319 bus service from the village?


What would make you use the service more often?


Would you be interested in a car / lift-sharing service to cut down on journeys eg to Bideford?



Do you use the Village Hall Post Office?




Have you ever attended an event in the Village Hall?




Have you ever hired the Village Hall?






How important is protecting the environment to you?



How important is the use of renewable energy to you?



There is no central community hub now. The shop was a source for the whole community to meet/ check in with each other/ place of safety for children if needed. We have a wonderful pub but that is not a place that all people will access. Pop up shop? Community shop. Shop/ cafe would be Perfect - especially for more isolated members of the community/ those with mobility issues/ the elderly.

Foot path / cycle path into Bideford.

Recycling facilities.

Re-route the drainage of surface water and lay new drains. Attend to the dropped curb outside the Old Vicarage to prevent rain water flowing across the pavement. Reduce the amount of traffic entering and passing through the village.

Provide adequate parking for The Thatched Inn as well as the Village Hall.

Stop building new homes here! Too many properties already and the infrastructure of the village can't cope. The question above regarding property development didn't cater for this answer I should add. Roads need to be improved re the pot holes. Furthermore, action MUST be taken to stop excessive speeding from Abbotsham Cross roundabout down into the village. I live in this area and am appalled at the

number of arrogant "boy racing" imbeciles who go hurtling past my home like Lewis Hamilton with his backside on fire. It is nothing short of a miracle that nobody has been seriously injured or killed on this road - a road with a SCHOOL on I hasten to add. Speed cameras or humps need to be seriously considered and something actually DONE and SOON. Secondly, the Sunday morning biker brigade who charge up Back Lane. Again this is downright dangerous and several young children live in the properties nearby. Another tragedy waiting to happen.

Internet speeds need improving as quite frankly what we have is nothing short of a joke. Bideford isn't exactly in the back of beyond as regards distance from the main Exchange.

Water pressure isn't great either which makes Eco mode on showers a pointless option.

Reduced and enforced speed limits - ideally 20 mph

Some parking restrictions to stop parking on both sides of road, especially during school drop off pick up and Sunday mornings.

I feel like people drive way too fast, so something to help with that.

I think we need a 7-5t weight restriction on the road though the village or access only for heavy vehicles. Also a 20mph from the top of the village to White House 30mph is far too fast.



Headline conclusions

Housing need / desires

- Emphasis on 1 / 2 bedroom homes (59.5% support for 1 / 2 bedroom starter homes, 51.4% support for 1 / 2 bedroom bungalows)
- 24.3% of employment either based from home or sometimes based from home
 - Desperate need for high quality broadband connection in order to support work from home and children's learning
- Desire for a village shop
 - But difficulties given lack of premises now

- Transport concerns
 - Speed of traffic
 - Lack of pavement to link the village to Bideford and also to Atlantic
 Village
 - o Parking improvements to provide for The Thatched Inn and Village Hall
 - Desire for cycle route improvements eg using former rail line

- Leisure

- o Improved facilities for older children
- More social events eg film nights, bingo
- Desire for a levelled playing field
- o Learning opportunities eg languages, digital upskilling

Our local environment

- 62.2% of respondents indicated that protecting the environment was of 10/10 importance to them
- 81.1% of respondents indicated that protecting the environment was of 9/10 or 10/10 importance to them
- 64.8% of respondents indicated that the use of renewable energy was either 9/10 or 10 / 10 importance to them
 - 59.4% then indicated (either 9 or 10 out of 10) that the parish should investigate developing its own renewable energy
 - 10 respondents then indicated a willingness to be involved in a renewable energy generation project.
 - Solar panels on the Village Hall roof or a community heat pump mentioned as possible ideas
- 9 respondents indicated a desire to be involved in biodiversity projects
- Trees / hedgerows / wild flower areas / not spraying weed killer all mentioned
